

THE IMPACT OF VOCA BRIDGE FUNDING

Support and pass \$20M for The VOCA Bridge to ensure the sustainability of victim services throughout the Commonwealth and to allow MOVA to better support survivors and their evolving needs.

What is the VOCA Bridge?

The **VOCA Bridge** is a funding request to the Massachusetts legislature to supplement drastically reduced federal funding to support victim services. \$20M was funded in FY23 and \$20M was funded in FY24. \$20M is still needed to support services in FY25. The data in this fact sheet is representative of services in FY23, the most recently completed grant award cycle.

What is the impact?

The following visuals illustrate the impact that FY23 VOCA Bridge dollars had on survivors, victims, and communities across the state.


Survivors Served

In FY23, **34,826** survivors were served that may not have otherwise had access to services without the VOCA Bridge.

Services Provided

In FY23, MOVA funded programs provided a total of **534,209** unique services. Of those services, **210,247** were rendered exclusively through VOCA Bridge dollars.
